Rebel Automated Shuttles welcomes the HagaShuttle

Together we reach further

As one of the first major Dutch cities, The Hague has acquired a self-driving minibus: the HagaShuttle. The festive opening took place at Haga Hospital on Monday 27 May. From now on, visitors and patients can travel the last few hundred meters at no charge from the public transport stop Leyenburg to the entrance of the hospital, location Leyweg. The HagaShuttle will initially run for four years.

For this initiative, HTM, Rebel Automated Shuttles and The Future Mobility Network have jointly established a company called Haagse Shuttle BV. To make the HagaShuttle possible, the Rotterdam The Hague Metropolitan Region (MRDH) has awarded a grant to the Haagse Shuttle BV from the Innovation Network Automatic Transport Last Mile (AVLM) program. In addition, the Haga Hospital contributes to the funding and facilities of the operation.

Seven passengers can travel aboard the shuttle, and one Haga steward. The HagaShuttle can also be used by people with a wheelchair (one per trip). HTM controls the operation of the HagaShuttle, including technical maintenance and remote traffic control. It does so commissioned by the Haagse Shuttle BV.

Rebel Automated Shuttles and partners believe in the value of autonomous transport. We work by developing and implementing new initiatives for the future of mobility. The HagaShuttle is the first self-driving shuttle link for us, and therefore an important milestone. But, with more use cases in preparation, certainly not the proverbial "last mile"!
